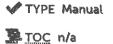

OVERALL COMMENT: Nathan will want to further develop the actual steps of a lesson. Though Nathan followed the steps to an effective lesson, he will want to build on each step. With only 15 minutes for the lesson, he will want to grab their attention in the Mental Set by talking with the students about what they will be doing/learning. In a lesson like this one, he will want to Model the learning, allow for Guided Practice, followed by Independent Practice, and then the Summary. To Nathan's credit, he had planned and had the students use manipulative materials appropriately. However, he will also want to further develop the Modeling portion of the lesson, before student practice is to begin. Modeling becomes more important for the primary grade students and can usually be less for the upper grades.
